### **A Little Bit of History**

The area that became the Village of Crete was settled in 1836 by Willard & Dyantha Wood. They traveled westward by land and water from Vermont and built a log cabin home near the center of town. The area was known as Wood's Corners until the roaming Crete Post Office moved there in 1844 when Willard Wood became its 4<sup>th</sup> Postmaster.

By the 1840's, Crete had multiple stops on the Underground Railroad. The stories of Caroline Quarlls, Mary Jane Safford and Samuel Cushing offer a glimpse into Crete's early history.

Willard Wood drew the plat for the town of Crete in 1848, which was officially recorded in Joliet on May 12, 1849.


